Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I'd like to give you an update on a few things. As you know, on July 1st I'll be starting a new assignment at USC and Fr. Francis Kim will begin as the new Administrator here at Visitation. Fr. Francis came the other weekend to meet Frs. Jim, Tim, Charlie, and Anguiano and to share a meal with us. It was a great visit! We shared stories, asked questions, and are doing our best to support Fr. Francis as he takes on this new role. In mid-June he will have a meet and greet with the Parish Staff and start moving his belongings over to the rectory. It's clear from our communication thus far that he is excited to start ministry at Visitation and I am at peace knowing you'll be in good hands.

In addition to wrapping things up at Visitation, I've been in communication with the Pastor and Staff at Our Savior Parish and USC Caruso Catholic Center. I'll be having meet and greets with people there and beginning my move in the month of June, as well. While it is sad to leave Visitation, I am filled with gratitude for the two years we've had together. I have no doubt that your love and support will carry me into my new assignment. Further, I'm excited to begin ministry with college students during this important time of discernment in their lives. Please pray that I be a humble instrument in the hands of God.

All of this is to say that we've entered a time of transition. Transitions are rarely easy because they entail losses of various sorts. There are losses of relationships, predictability, meaning, identity, control, a sense of the future... the list goes on. Sometimes we try to hide or ignore these losses (which is understandable). However, I think it's important that we be honest with ourselves and bring it all to God in prayer. Despite the challenges, I know the Lord will lead and guide us all if we are open and attentive to His voice. It's also important that we manage this process of change with the help of a trusted friend, mentor, spiritual guide, or counselor. At the end of the day each one of us will have to decide how we will respond, personally, to all of this and it can be very helpful to have someone walking with us. This sort of vulnerability can be uncomfortable initially but in time it is tremendously liberating and life-giving. Please consider it!

Many of you have reached out to me for meetings, meals, and appointments. I am doing my best to make time for everyone but I'm quickly becoming aware of my limits. Thank you for understanding and for your kind generosity. I'm forever grateful.

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS

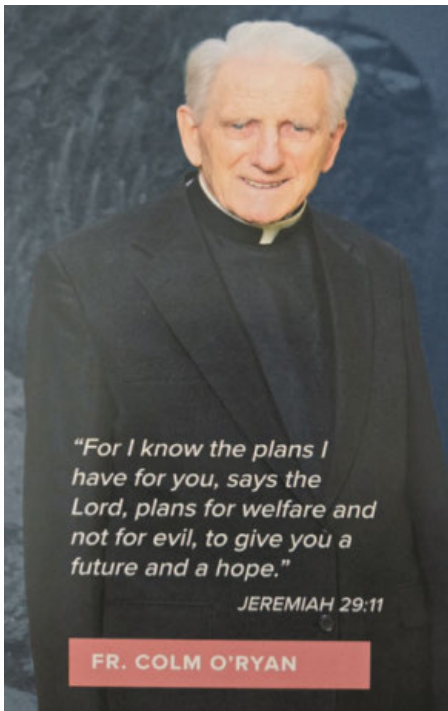
DID YOU KNOW? What color swimsuit is best for water safety?

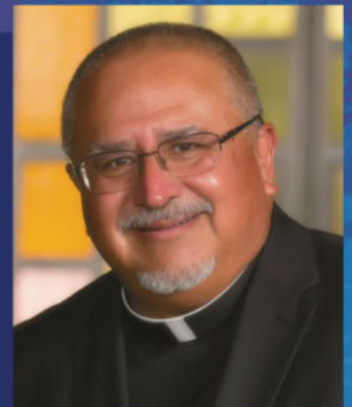

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

QUESTION:

How do I bring God into the work of my daily life?

ANSWER:

Whatever your daily work, you have an opportunity to encounter God and to follow His commandments in love. In the New Testament, we see that most of the Apostles didn't have a previous religious position. They were fishermen, tax collectors, and political activists. St. Paul was a tentmaker. Among the saints, we have doctors, lawyers, farmers, and stay-at-home moms. No matter your daily tasks, God can be present there!

One way concerns behavior. Start with an examination of conscience. Look at areas where you tend to struggle to imitate Christ at work. Do you gossip? Does brimming frustration become impatience at home? Pick one sin you struggle with, then choose a virtue to strengthen that area. If you tend to speak poorly of your co-workers, resolve to stop and to say one kind thing a day instead.

Another way relates to perspective, particularly your perspective of others. Jesus' incarnation reminds us of the value of every human being. Jesus is God, and each of us is created in God's image. When you encounter another person, you have an opportunity to see God in a new place and a new way – in that person in front of you. Genuinely listen to them and be present to their concerns. Loving your neighbor is loving God! Our relationship with God and the love He inspires in our hearts shouldn't remain only at church on Sunday. We can – and should – let our faith animate our lives!

We're able to create a space for praying and talking about life with Christ in the midst of this."

---Hundreds of parishioners from eight Archdiocese of LA parishes will be joining Archbishop Gomez during the Mass at the Basilica July 6---

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles' community is invited to send prayers of intention to be blessed by Archbishop José H. Gomez and presented to Our Lady of Guadalupe at the Basilica or Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City during a pilgrimage Mass that Archbishop Gomez will be celebrating on Saturday, July 6, 2024, at 12 p.m. local time (11 a.m. PST).

Prayer intentions will be collected at the Cathedral through Father's Day June 16. Please see cathedral's Mass schedule. You can also submit them online at <https://lacatholics.org/pilgrimage/> by June 20.

This will be the fifth pilgrimage year ---with a three-year break due to the pandemic--- under the spiritual leadership of Archbishop Gomez. This is the second consecutive year that hundreds of faithful are joining parochial groups who will travel to Mexico City on different dates, most of them departing on July 4 and returning July 9, with stops at Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, home of the original tilma (or cloak) of St. Juan Diego, which holds the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe that appeared in 1531. Some of the parochial groups will visit landmarks such as Teotihuacan Pyramids and Catholic parishes in Guanajuato and Puebla, among others.

All are invited to view the Mass and pray along with our brothers and sisters at the Basilica, as it will be livestreamed on <https://lacatholics.org/pilgrimage/>.

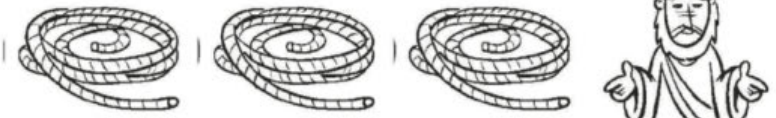
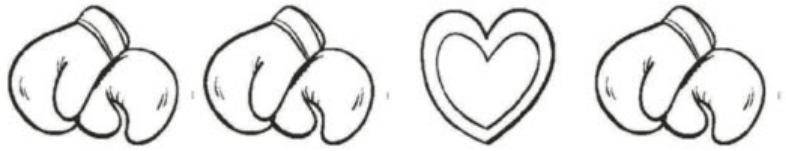
Sharing the Gospel




